

Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH)

Honeywell is committed to ensuring that all Honeywell products manufactured in or imported into the European Union (EU) comply with EU REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals) legislative requirements.

Honeywell completed the necessary pre-registrations in 2008 and high volume substance registrations in 2010. Additional dossiers are being completed to meet substance volume deadlines in 2013 and 2018. Honeywell monitors the Candidate List and European Chemical Agency's (ECHA) recommendations for authorization.

Honeywell's Obligations as a Supplier

A comprehensive program has been established to ensure that the pre-registration, registration and notification requirements of REACH are met for Honeywell's products manufactured in or imported into the EU. Honeywell will meet all communication requirements to downstream users.

Honeywell's Requirements for Suppliers

Honeywell expects all of its suppliers to understand and comply with REACH. Honeywell suppliers that import or manufacture substances and preparations (mixtures of two or more chemical substances) into the EU must pre-register and/or register the substances according to the volumes and timelines established.

Suppliers must assess the content of finished products supplied to Honeywell against the list of substances of very high concern (SVHC) and inform Honeywell if these substances are present in a concentration of more than 0.1% by weight. If the total volume of these SVHCs exceeds one ton per year then the supplier must also communicate to ECHA.
